The **Wildcats football teams** have picked up right where they left off last season as they continue to be a strong presence in the Bux-Mont League. Football Clarifications

We have been asked more than a few times what football will do with the money we saved on not purchasing new jerseys and if parents will receive any refunds. We didn't "save" money on jerseys, we just didn't spend money that we didn't have. The football program will cost over \$30,000 this season due to the increase in participants and having to outfit new players completely. Flag uniforms cost three times what we spent on them last season. What

football brought in that it can spend from registrations is about \$20,000. That difference will have to be borrowed from the snack stand and made up in fundraising.

Each year there are complaints about how much it cost to participate and then questions about not keeping our jerseys and not getting our names on them. The numbers just don't work. Football & cheerleading have not raised their sports fees in almost a decade. In talking with league reps from around Bux-Mont, other programs charge what we do and more, plus fundraise upwards of \$50,000 to make their program work. Next year we will try to push sponsorships for our program. Please get involved and try and help improve whatever we can. PennDel Football has doubled in size over the past two seasons and we expect to have over 300 football players next season. We're going through some growing pains, but we must be doing some things right!
