Flag 2 It was a great game for Flag 2 (White). Zach McNamee played quarterback and accounted for 2 additional scores when he took the ball straight up the middle on quarterback keepers and went in for long runs untouched. Michael Wallick punched the ball in for the extra point and also played defense accounting for 3 flags, 2 behind the line of scrimmage and 1 where he caught the runner from behind preventing a 1st down. Kieran Crozier showed why he is a force to be reckoned with on the defensive line when he wreaked havoc in the backfield all day pulling flags. Caleb Jordan also had several outstanding plays at middle linebacker when he pulled a couple of flags behind the line of scrimmage on key 3 and 4th down plays. Antonio Giampa was outstanding on defense running players down from behind and preventing scores. Jacob Herb is a player to watch with his aggressive and relentless play at the line of scrimmage. Gaven Shapcott blew open holes on the Offensive line and stuffed the run while playing defensive tackle.
